It's HOT Out There!



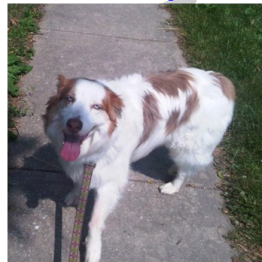
Ace needs a break from the heat!

Summer Safety Tips

- 🐾 Make sure your pet has plenty of water at all times.
 - 🐾 Do not leave your pet outside for extended periods of time in extreme heat.
 - 🐾 Never leave your pet in a parked car, even with the windows down. It is extremely dangerous and illegal.
 - 🐾 Don't let your pet linger on hot asphalt. The heat causes them to overheat very quickly and it can burn the sensitive pads of their feet.
 - 🐾 Know the signs of overheating in your pet: excessive panting or difficulty breathing; increased heart and respiratory rate; drooling; weakness; stupor; bloody diarrhea and vomiting; body temperature over 104 degrees. Dogs release body heat by panting and through the pads of their feet. If you think your dog is becoming overheated, place their feet in cold water and wet their body with cold water.
 - 🐾 **Seek medical attention immediately if:**
 - ★ you can't cool them down
 - ★ they lose consciousness.
- Heat stroke can be deadly to your pet.

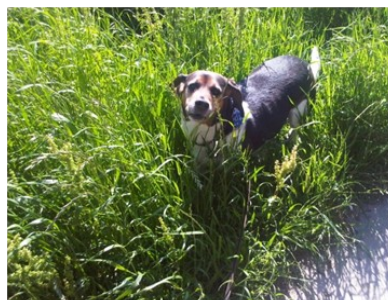
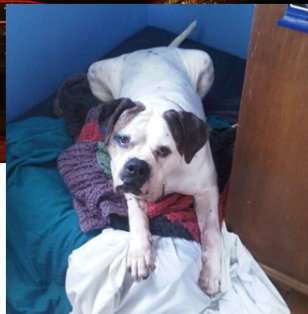


4th of July

Happy 4th of July!

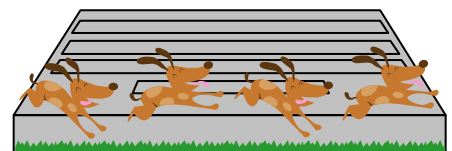
