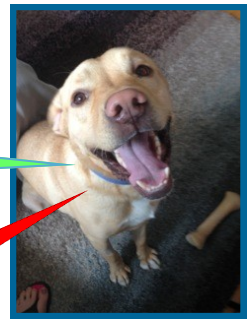

Life is short...

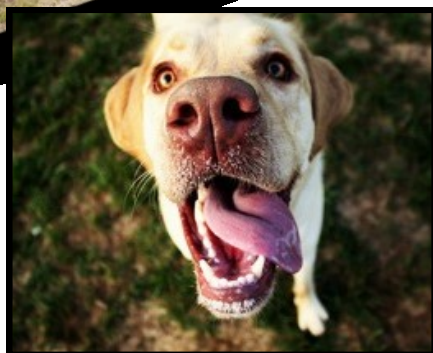

Cancer...sadly many of us will be affected by this terrible disease at some point in our lives. Did you know one in three dogs will suffer from cancer also? The thought of losing your pup to a cruel disease is really scary. We've recently lost a client-pup, **Devaney** to cancer at a very early age, and it brought the reality of this disease to our attention. Sometimes there are no signs that your dog is sick, but often there are. If you catch it early enough it could make a difference. Here is what to look for -

The warning signs of cancer in dogs are very similar to that in people. A lump or a bump, a wound that doesn't heal, any kind of swelling, enlarged lymph nodes, a lameness or swelling in the bone, abnormal bleeding. Those are all classic signs. Any time an animal isn't feeling well, or there's something abnormal or not quite right, bring it to the attention of your veterinarian as soon as possible.

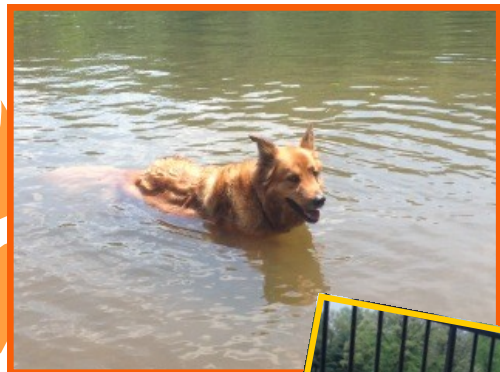

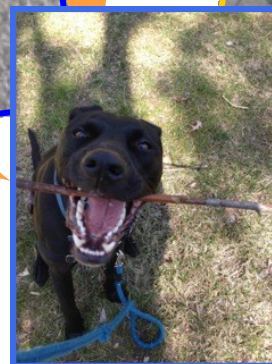
